Day Services

Open daily to anyone in need, our Day Services work to eliminate the immediate needs of the homeless and working poor.

- 1. Five calls to the crisis intervention, information and referral line \$24
- 2. Seven days of emergency services for a homeless client (community kitchen, shower, phone, message service..... \$55
- 3. Provide an emergency food box for a family of four..... \$92

Housing

Community Outreach offers both emergency and transitional housing to men, women and families in our community

- 4. One week of transitional shelter, case management, and support services for a family \$345
- 5. One night of emergency shelter, food and hygiene supplies for a single, homeless man or woman \$69
- 6. Provide one night of transitional shelter, case management and supportives services for a single adult \$62

Clinics

Our medical and dental clinics provide care to low-income people without insurance.

- 7. One visit to our medical clinic..... \$79
- 8. One visit to our Diabetes Education class \$35
- 9. Dental treatment for someone without insurance or means to afford dental care..... \$102

Behavioral Health Treatment Services

Providing counseling, alcohol and drug treatment, domestic abuse intervention and domestic violence services

- 10. Supply a client one week of drug and alcohol counseling..... \$66
- 11. Two weeks of counseling for a mental health client..... \$120
- 12. Crisis counseling for a victim of domestic violence \$80

- 15. One week of arts, crafts, toys and clean-up supplies
for the child care center..... \$50

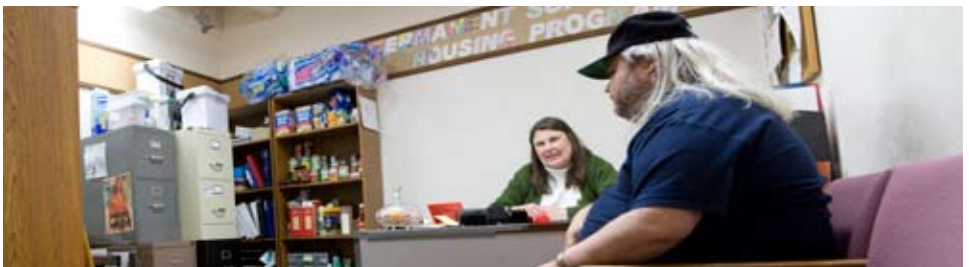
Permanent Supportive Housing

Providing daily case management services to mentally ill and disabled residents of Benton County

- 16. One day of case management to all clients enrolled
in the Permanent Supportive Housing program \$225
- 17. Provide transportation for one day to a Permanent
Supportive Housing client..... \$23
- 18. One month of social activities for our clients \$99
